The AFVGA Grow Forward Award honors Alabama fruit and vegetable growers who are shaping the future of specialty crop production through bold ideas, strategic thinking and strong leadership. This award highlights both established producers introducing fresh innovations on their farms and emerging growers with clear, actionable visions for long-term success.

Applicants will be evaluated on how they address key challenges in production, marketing, labor, technology or sustainability. For beginner farmers, a well-defined growth plan and potential for lasting impact are essential. Across all applicants, leadership, creativity and a drive to improve Alabama's specialty crop industry are at the heart of this recognition.

Finalists will be invited to pitch their ideas live in a dynamic, Shark Tank-style session at the AFVGA Annual Conference in February. A panel of industry judges will select the recipient based on the strength of their vision, execution and potential for positive change.

About the Award

During the contest, participants will be judged on:

- Leadership in and vision for the specialty crop industry
- Innovation in the specialty crop industry
- Participation/involvement in AFVGA and other organizations (i.e. civic, church and professional development)

Eligibility

Applicants must be

- An individual or a farming couple that is married
- Member of AFVGA/Alabama Farmers Federation
- At least 18 years of age; there is no maximum age.
- Alabama producer of fruits, vegetables, nuts, cut flowers, etc.

Current employees of the Alabama Farmers Federation and First South Farm Credit are not eligible.

Awards

- Finalists will be selected to compete at the AFVGA Conference to give their live presentation to the judges. The finalists will receive free registration and lodging at the conference.

- The overall winner will receive a \$5,000 grand prize.
 - A 1099 form will be issued from AFVGA. The winner must provide a W-9 before receiving the award.
 - Participation in follow-up interactions with AFVGA, First South Farm Credit and the Alabama Farmers Federation's communications staff is mandatory in order to publicize the winner and their plans with the award.

Quality & Clarity	10	Quality of writing, thoughtfulness and adherence to application guidelines

3. Leadership & Community Engagement (25 Points)

Explain your involvement in the agricultural community, including your leadership roles in AFVGA, other farming organizations or local/community activities. How have you mentored or influenced others in your community or industry?

If selected as a finalist, you will be asked to present a live, Shark Tank-style pitch at the AFVGA Annual Conference. The presentation should focus on your innovation, growth vision or impact on the industry. Presentations will be scored based on delivery, content, and responses to judge questions.
